Pioneer valley christian academy

Pioneer Valley Christian Academy is a private non-denominational Christian school located in Springfield, Massachusetts. Founded in 1972, the academy has over 350 students enrolled from Pre-K to Grade 12. The institution is accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and the New England Association of Christian Schools (NEACS). The school's Head of School is Joshua Keegan. The academy began as East Longmeadow Christian Day School in September 1972, with 18 students, one teacher, and a headmaster. As the school grew, additional grades were added, and in 1975, a high school for Grades 9-12 was established. In 1980, Timothy Duff joined the school as Headmaster. The academy has undergone several expansions, including the addition of six classrooms to the elementary wing in 2002 and a 17,000-square-foot expansion in 2009 that included a science lab, art room, technology room, music rooms, and additional classrooms. In 2016, the academy completed a 39,000 square-foot addition that added a new gymnasium, training rooms, locker rooms, library, and additional classrooms. As of 2023, Headmaster Timothy Duff retired after 43 years, and Joshua Keegan was hired as the new Head of School. Important dates for the upcoming school year have been announced. The Fall Focus High School Retreat will take place on Monday, and students can use their free admission tickets to visit the Big E after 3 PM. CYO Basketball sign-ups begin on Wednesday. Next week, the Mandatory Middle School Retreat is scheduled from Thursday to Friday. On October 4, a required meeting for parents with students enrolled in Discovery will be held at 7:00 PM. Individual school pictures will take place on Friday, and a prayer meeting with the Board of Directors is scheduled for Saturday morning. There are several breaks throughout the month, including Columbus Day on October 14, Veterans' Day on November 11, and Thanksgiving Vacation from Wednesday to Friday of that week. School resumes on December 2, and the high school sports season begins shortly after. In January, students will have a winter break from Monday, January 17 to Friday, January 21. The school year picks up again on January 24, with J-Term starting for middle and high school students. February brings another winter break, this time from Monday, February 17 to Friday, February 21. As the semester comes to a close, several important events are scheduled. On March 6, the school will resume after spring break, and on March 28, there will be a morning professional development session for staff and parents-teacher conferences in the afternoon. The National Junior Honor Society Induction will take place on March 6 at 6:30 PM, followed by the National Honor Society Induction at 7:30 PM. On April 3, Grade 6 Orientation is scheduled, and on May 1, there will be a National Day of Prayer. The school year concludes with graduation rehearsals on Friday, June 5, and the high school commencement ceremony that evening. Throughout the month of May, several important events are taking place. These include the Early Childhood Education Conference on April 17, which will run concurrently with Preschool's Spring Concert at 6:00 PM. There will also be a spring concert for grades K-12 on April 23. The school's final day before summer break will be on Friday, where students will be dismissed at 11:30 AM. The fourth quarter comes to a close on this day. On the following Saturday, there will be a prayer meeting with the Board of Directors starting at 8:00 AM. A Christian education philosophy views life through a comprehensive lens that encompasses God, humanity, and the universe. According to this perspective, God remains constant and has revealed Himself in nature, in Jesus Christ, and through the Bible, which holds authoritative power over matters of faith, truth, and practice. Christian education begins with knowing God through Jesus Christ, who holds within Him all treasures of wisdom and knowledge (Colossians 2:3). True education cannot occur without this understanding of God. People are dependent on God for their ability to learn truth and interpret facts, as stated in I Corinthians 2:14. Christian education fosters a biblical relationship among the family, church, and the Christian Academy. The Scriptures emphasize that parents are accountable to God for educating their children. It is crucial that the home and the Christian Academy collaborate to fulfill this responsibility. Knowledge of the Bible and Jesus Christ integrated into the curriculum is vital for children's physical, mental, social, and spiritual development. Behavior rooted in a correct understanding of life's origin and purpose should be guided by the principle that everything done "to the glory of God" (I Corinthians 10:31). God is the source of truth, and people rely on Him to understand spiritual concepts. Christian education aims to develop a Biblical relationship in family, church, and school. Parents are accountable to God for their children's education, and cooperation between home and school is essential. Knowledge of the Bible and Jesus Christ integrated into the curriculum helps children grow spiritually, mentally, socially, and physically. We believe that knowing the whole Bible, inspired by God, is essential for living a righteous life. The concept of one Triune God, with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as three co-equal persons, is vital. Our Lord Jesus Christ is fully God and fully man, sinless in His life, death, and resurrection, all endeavors to alter one's innate biological sex – including elective sex-reassignment, transvestite, transgender, or non-binary "genderqueer" conduct – are deemed a rejection of the divine image within (Genesis 1:26-28; Psalm 139:13-16; Romans 1:26-32; I Corinthians 6:9-11). We believe marriage is solely between one man and one woman, forming an exclusive, permanent, comprehensive, and conjugal union as defined in scripture for the purpose of procreation and establishing a biological family (Genesis 2:18-25; I Corinthians 6:18; 7:2-5; Hebrews 13:4). God intends intimate relationships to occur only within a man-woman marriage. Any form of sexual immorality, including co-habitation, adultery, fornication, incest, etc., is considered sinful and must not be practiced (Genesis 2:18-25; Matthew 15:18-20; I Corinthians 6:9-10, 18; 7:2-5; Hebrews 13:4). We believe salvation comes through Christ's atoning death, affected by the Holy Spirit's regenerating work, and received by confessing sin, seeking mercy, and trusting in Christ's finished work (Acts 3:19-21; Romans 3:23; 10:9-10; I Corinthians 6:9-11). We also believe in the resurrection of both saved and lost souls, with the saved rising to eternal life and the lost to damnation (John 5:24, 28, 29).
